#### Talk PANTS

With the help of NSPCC's friendly dinosaur Pantosaurus, Talk PANTS is a simple conversation to help keep your child safe from sexual abuse.

Pantosaurus has helped 1.5 million parents Talk PANTS and keep their children safe from sexual abuse.

Developed in consultation with children, parents, carers and teachers, Talk PANTS is there to help children understand their body belongs to them, and they should tell a safe adult they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried.
